GOOSE CREEK MAN FACES COMPUTER CRIME CHARGE

The South Carolina Law Enforcement Division's (SLED) Computer Crimes Center agents announce the arrest of a Goose Creek man on accusations that he had child pornography on an electronic media storage device at his residence.

J.L. Taylor, III, 61, of 142 Sass Drive, Goose Creek, S.C., is charged with **Second Degree Sexual Exploitation of a Minor** as part of the S.C. Attorney General's Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (ICAC).

According to investigators, Taylor is accused of uploading child pornography via the internet.

With a search warrant in hand, investigators seized a computer disk from Taylor's residence.

They found images of children engaging in sexual activity on that media device.

Second Degree Sexual Exploitation of a Minor is a felony punishable up to ten (10) years in prison.

This case was referred to SLED from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, (NCMEC).

The Berkeley County Sheriff's Office assisted with this investigation.

The case will be prosecuted by the S.C. Attorney General's Office.
