WILLIAMSBURG COUNTY MAN ARRESTED IN CHILD PORNOGRAPHY INVESTIGATION

The South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) announces the arrest of a Hemingway man accused of having child pornography on his computer.

Christopher James Cox, 25, of 406 East Andrews Road, Hemingway, S.C., is charged with **Second Degree Sexual Exploitation of a Minor**.

According to arrest warrants, Cox had visual materials depicting minors engaged in sexual activity on a computer at his home.

With a search warrant, SLED agents confiscated electronic media from Cox's home during an undercover operation.

This is the 236th Sexual Exploitation/Criminal Solicitation case investigated by the SC Computer Crimes Center.

The Williamsburg County Sheriff's Office, Hemingway Police Department and Immigration and Customs Agents assisted with this investigation.

Second Degree Sexual Exploitation of a Minor is a felony offense punishable up to ten (10) years in prison.

The case will be prosecuted by the SC Attorney General's Office as part of the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (ICAC).
