SLED HUNTS FOR BABY KILLER IN WALTERBORO

OTHERS KILLED AND SEVERAL INJURED IN DRIVE-BY SHOOTING

The South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) and the Walterboro Public Safety Department are investigating a deadly drive-by shooting in Walterboro that killed at least three people including a toddler.

The shooting happened around 10:45 last night at the intersection of Gerideau and McDaniel Streets.

According to witnesses, a crowd was gathered outside of a home on McDaniel Street playing cards when a dark-colored vehicle drove by and fired several gunshots at the people.

According to Agents, six other people were shot and are being treated for their injuries at area hospitals.

Director Reggie Lloyd says, "The youngest victim in this case should be alive with her family right now. Instead, she is another tragedy in another senseless violent crime. This is a heartbreaking tragedy that could and should have been avoided. These acts of violence will not be tolerated in South Carolina. SLED will continue to be aggressive in curbing violent crimes across the board."

SLED has a strong presence in Walterboro and has assembled investigators, crime scene agents and other personnel to find the shooter or shooters.
