MARION SCHOOL DISTRICT TWO SUPERINTENDENT ARRESTED: **CHARGED WITH EMBEZZLEMENT**

The South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) announces the arrest of the Superintendent of Marion School District Two, after allegations that he misappropriated money from his employer.

Nathaniel Miller, 59, of 206 Azalea Drive, Mullins, S.C., is charged with **Embezzlement of Public Funds**.

According a SLED arrest warrant, while being the Marion School District Two Superintendent, Dr. Miller converted more than \$500,000 of the District's money for his personal use between the dates of March 2006 to on or about January 2010.

Agents accuse Miller of living lavishly, paying mortgages and college tuition and rent for his children with those funds.

Miller turned himself in to SLED Agents this afternoon at the Richland County Courthouse in Columbia, S.C.

Embezzlement of Public Funds is a felony offense punishable up to twenty (20) years in prison and fines at the discretion of the court.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Columbia Division's Public Corruption Task Force assisted with this investigation.

This case will be prosecuted by the South Carolina Attorney General's Office.
